





Kingsport Aquatic Center

The Kingsport Aquatic Center is a yearround water wonderland for the whole family. With a waterpark, indoor and outdoor pools, and swimming classes, there's something here for everyone.



Brickyard Park

A 43-acre premier sports facility and community park, this smoke-free facility includes 4 fenced and lighted ball fields with electric scoreboards and bleachers. This is a perfect place to enjoy some sports and fun.



Kingsport Greenbelt

With access points all across the city of Kingsport, this paved and scenic trail is 10 miles long and is a favorite destination for walkers, runners, bicycles and peaceful moments.



Warriors' Path State Park

The 950-acre park is home to premier boating and fishing activity, hiking trails, an internationally-renowned mountain bike trail system, an award-winning nature education program, and a nationally recognized golf course.



Bays Mountain Park

Bays Mountain Park and Planetarium features a picturesque 44-acre lake, hiking trails, a Nature Center with a state-of-the-art Planetarium Theater, and Animal Habitats featuring wolves, bobcats, raptors and reptiles.



Fort Patrick Henry Lake

Fort Patrick Henry Reservoir, on the South Fork Holston River in east Tennessee, extends 10 miles upstream from the dam to Boone Dam. The site is a popular fishing and picnicking destination for the Tri-Cities.



Scott Adams Skate Park

The 10,000 sq ft concrete skatepark includes two bowls (backyard bowl and a flow bowl), a four-stair set with up-down rails, two quarter pipes, an up-down hubba ledge, a five-stair with a down rail and a pyramid, among other features.



Pump Track

Located beside the Scott Adams Skate Park, lives the Pump Track. A state-of-the-art track that will be open to skateboarders as well as bikers. The track features a unique wall that users will be able to climb up as they make a 180-degree turn.



INDUSTRY



BAE SYSTEMS

Spanning more than 6,000 acres, the BAE Systems Holston Army Ammunition Plant is the major supplier of explosive materials to the U.S. Department of Defense. The facility has state-of-the-art equipment and capabilities. The Kingsport facility is specifically focused on manufacturing and supplying high-performance gun systems, munitions, and related components for land, sea, and air applications. Since being built in the 1940s to support the war effort, the site has played an important role in every American conflict.



DOMTAR

Opened in 1916, the Domtar pulp and paper mill is a stand-alone energy source, which reuses up to 100 percent of its manufacturing waste. Domtar Kingsport is now adjusting to market demand to become the first packaging facility for the company. The mill will produce and market about 600,000 tons of high-quality recycled linerboard and corrugated medium annually, making it the second-largest recycled containerboard machine in North America.



EASTMAN

A global specialty materials and chemical company that manufactures and supplies a wide range of products for industries such as transportation, construction, healthcare, and consumer goods.





SILGAN CLOSURES

As the industry leader in food and beverage closure solutions, Silgan Closures focuses on coatings and liners, removal torque, and tamper evidence. They provide high-end containment products and a large workforce for the community.

LECLERC

Leclerc U.S. headquarters opened in Kingsport in 2008. This year, Leclerc Foods is said to invest \$3.4 million, and create 48 new jobs in Sullivan County. This full-sized production plant creates a variety of food goods.
